- Superintendent Raulerson announced that she recently attended the Florida Association of District School Superintendents (FADSS) conference where it was decided that all 67 superintendents are taking a strong and bold stance in issuing a public statement of concern in reference to the state's accountability system. Superintendent Raulerson read aloud a press release from the Florida Association of District School Superintendents titled Florida Superintendents Have Lost Confidence in the Accountability System. Superintendent Raulerson also stated that the stance has been supported by the Florida PTA. Superintendent Raulerson noted that the action taken by all 67 district superintendents is historical in nature and she reiterated that this is in no way against accountability as it is needed, however, the accountability system should be fair, accurate, and unflawed. Superintendent Raulerson encouraged everyone to call or visit the legislature and stand shoulder to shoulder for change. She also stated that Baker County teachers and staff are doing a great job with teaching and learning and preparing our students for college level courses and careers and that she will keep everyone up to date on this matter. The FADSS release was also forwarded to all district staff, via email, on September 28, 2015, by Superintendent Raulerson.
